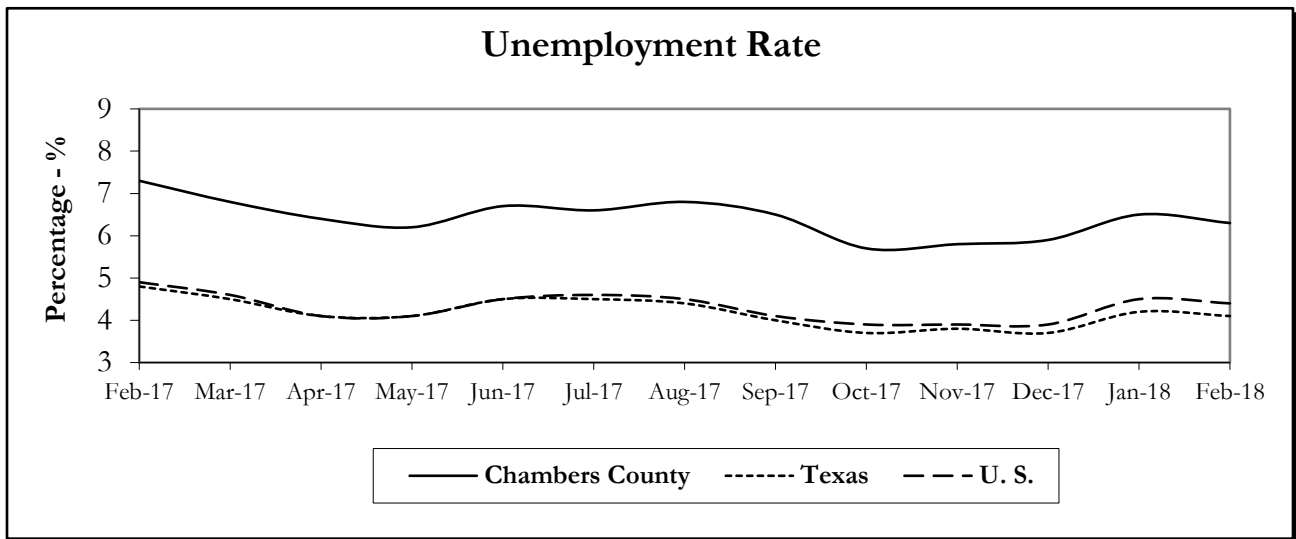


County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Chambers County dropped two-tenths of a percentage point to 6.3 percent in February, down from 7.3 percent one year earlier but higher than the state’s 4.1 percent rate and nation’s 4.4 percent rate. Total covered employment in the county had its strongest second quarter increase since 2011, up 792 jobs or 6.1 percent. Several private industry sectors managed gains but the largest was in Construction, up 408 jobs or 28.3 percent. The county added 97 jobs over the year, up 0.7 percent from second quarter 2016. The increase was made possible by gains in Trade, Transportation & Utilities, Construction, Education & Health Services, and Other Services. Natural Resources & Mining suffered a decline of 433 jobs, 63.8 percent, holding over-the-year gains to a minimum. The only other substantial decline was in Manufacturing, down 62 jobs or 2.7 percent. See page 2 for additional data.

*Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
