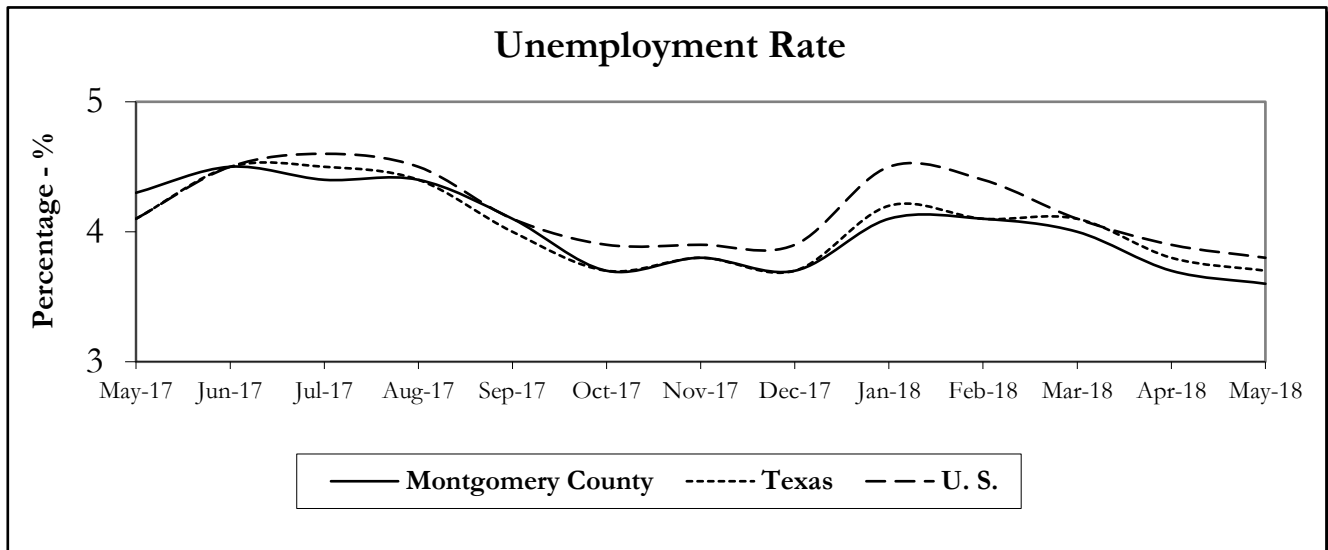
Labor Market Information

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County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Montgomery County fell one-tenth of a percentage point to 3.6 percent in May, slightly lower than the stat's 3.7 percent rate and nation's 3.8 percent rate. Total covered employment in the county was up 6,849 jobs over fourth quarter 2017. The 3.9 percent increase was the strongest quarter increase since first quarter 2005. Most industry sectors reported increases with largest gains in Local Government, up 3,068 jobs or 12.3 percent, and Trade, Transportation, & Utilities, up 1,382 jobs or 3.9 percent. The pace of job growth in the county rose to its highest level in nearly three years, up 6.4 percent or 11,049 jobs. Job gains were widespread with the largest increases found in Professional & Business Services, up 3,248 jobs or 15.0 percent, and Construction, up 1,898 jobs or 15.0 percent. The pace of job growth in Manufacturing continued to rise, up from 4.5 percent in the third quarter to 7.7 percent, up 737 jobs. The only decline reported was in State Government, down 35 jobs or 6.7 percent. See page 2 for detailed data.

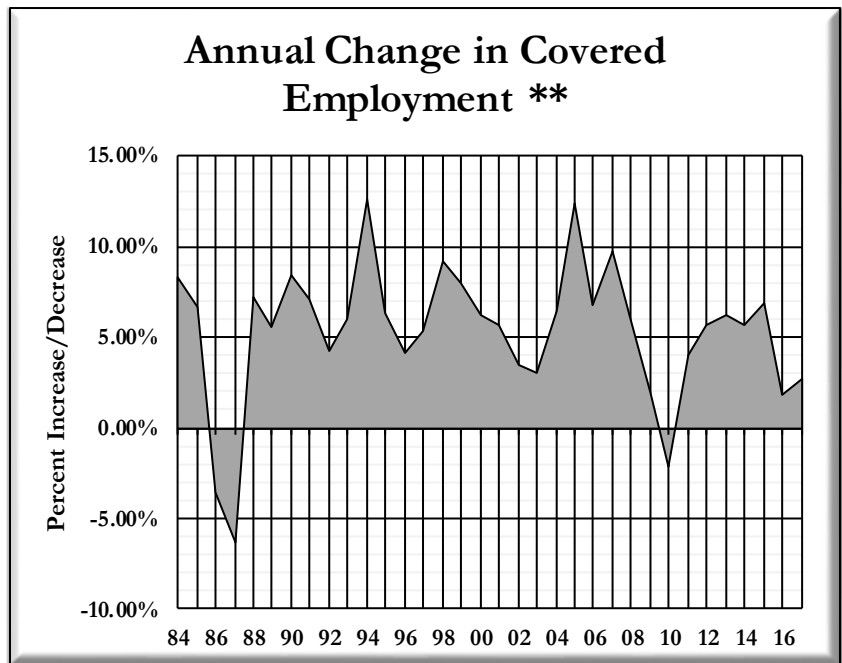
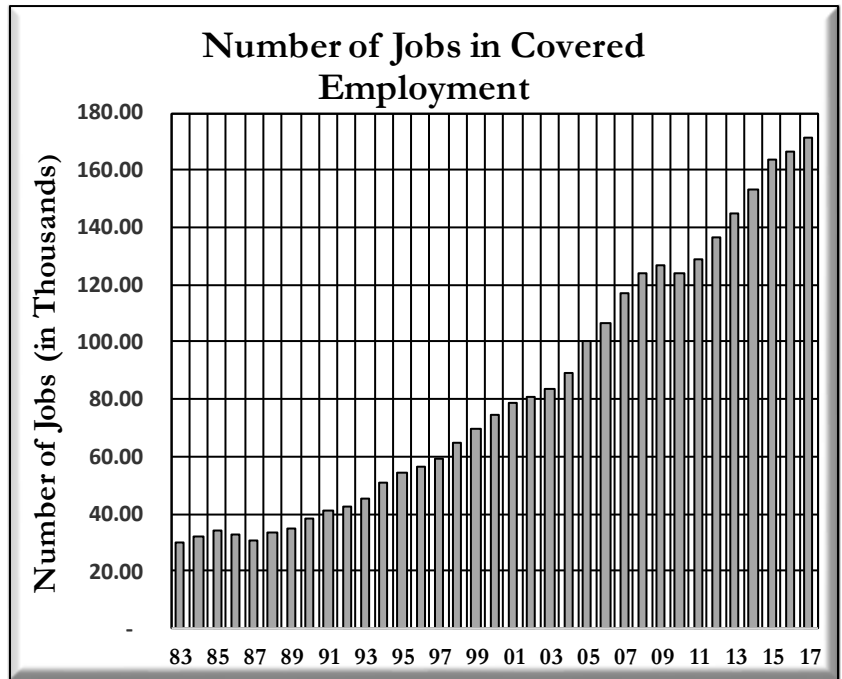

*Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
