EMPLOYERS ADDED A PALTRY 3,600 JOBS IN MAY

(HOUSTON, Texas, June 20, 2025) — Houston-area employers added just 3,600 jobs across all industries in May, a figure that falls substantially below the long-term trend, according to data released Friday by Workforce Solutions - Gulf Coast.

The leisure and hospitality sector, staffing up ahead of summer, added 7,600 jobs, primarily in restaurants and bars, well above the long-term average of 4,400 for May. The trade, transportation and utilities sector contributed another 3,000 jobs, mostly in the warehousing subsector.

But those gains were not enough to offset continued weakness in the business and professional services sector, which lost 3,200 jobs last month and had its April hiring numbers revised downward by 1,700.

"May's report aligns with our expectation of a labor market slowdown, which will likely continue through the rest of the year," said Parker Harvey, an economist with the workforce development agency. Harvey added that all four sectors that posted losses during the month were "substantially at odds with the long-term average," which typically sees jobs added during the last month of spring.

Government (-3,000), construction (-900) and manufacturing (-800) sectors posted a combined loss of 4,700 jobs, adding to the declines in business and professional services.

The unemployment rate in the Houston area rose three-tenths of a percentage point in May to a not seasonally adjusted 4.2%. Seasonally adjusted unemployment was not reported, but the statewide average held steady at 4.1% between March and April.
