
### 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2002 Data

Covered employment in the WorkSource Area rose by 0.5% over the quarter. Affected by seasonal declines and the uncertain economy, Natural Resources & Mining, -1.4%, Construction, -0.5%, Manufacturing, -1.3%, Information, -1.3%, Professional & Business Services, -1.3%, Leisure & Hospitality, -2.6%, and Other Services. -5.8%, suffered losses. Seasonal hiring for Christmas shopping boosted Trade, Transportation, & Utilities, +1.4%. Population gains and administrative adjustments helped Financial Activities, +0.3%, Education & Health Services, +0.6%, Federal Government, +4.2%, State Government, +2.3%, and Local Government, +7.9% Over the year, the area's jobs total sank mildly (-0.1%). Hit by the economic doldrums and administrative adjustments were Natural Resources & Mining, -7.8%, Manufacturing, -5.5%, Trade, Transportation, & Utilities, -1.9%, Information, -9.2%, Financial Activities, -0.7%, Professional & Business Services, -0.2%, and Other Services, -1.5%. Increases from population pressures and administrative adjustments helped Education & Health Services, +3.9%, Leisure & Hospitality, +3.7%, Federal Government, +16.1%, State Government, +2.9%, and Local Government, +4.3%.



Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. The average is computed by totaling the pay of all workers and dividing by the number of workers, weighted by hours.
