Liberty County is located in East Central Texas and is one of 13 counties in the Gulf Coast Region. Liberty County's 2010 population was 75,643. Liberty is the county seat. Other towns include Cleveland and Dayton. The Manufacturing, Trade, Service, and Local Government Sectors fuel county employment. Liberty County is one of the original counties established in Texas in 1836. The average unemployment rate in Liberty County for 2011 was 10.6 percent.

Per Capita Personal Income (2009)

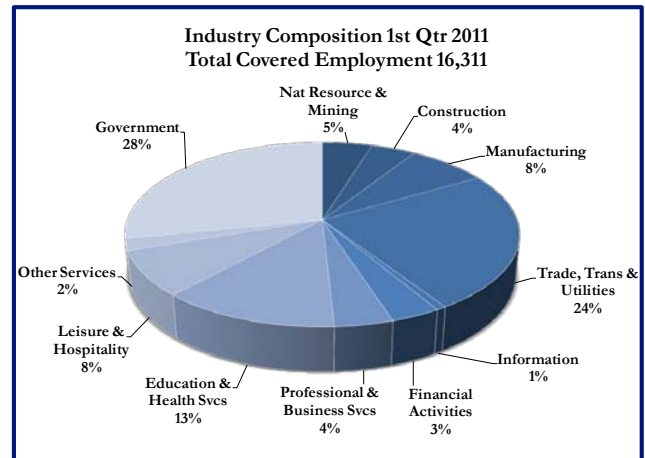
\$33,729 ranking 109th in the State and was 87 percent of the State average, \$38,609. The annual growth rate over the past 10 years was 5.3 percent as compared to 3.9 percent for the State and 3.4 percent for the nation.

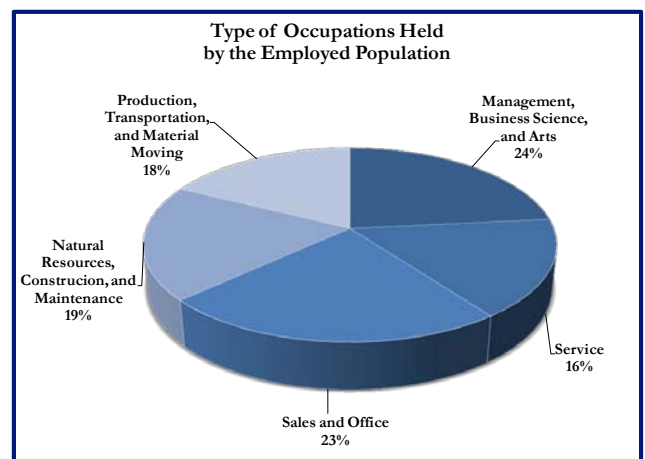
Median Household Income (2010)
