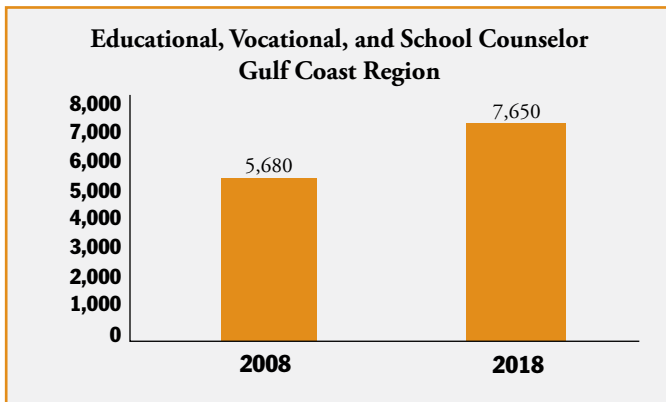

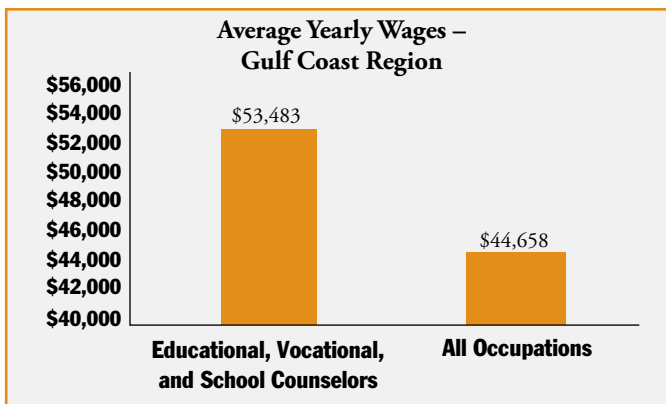

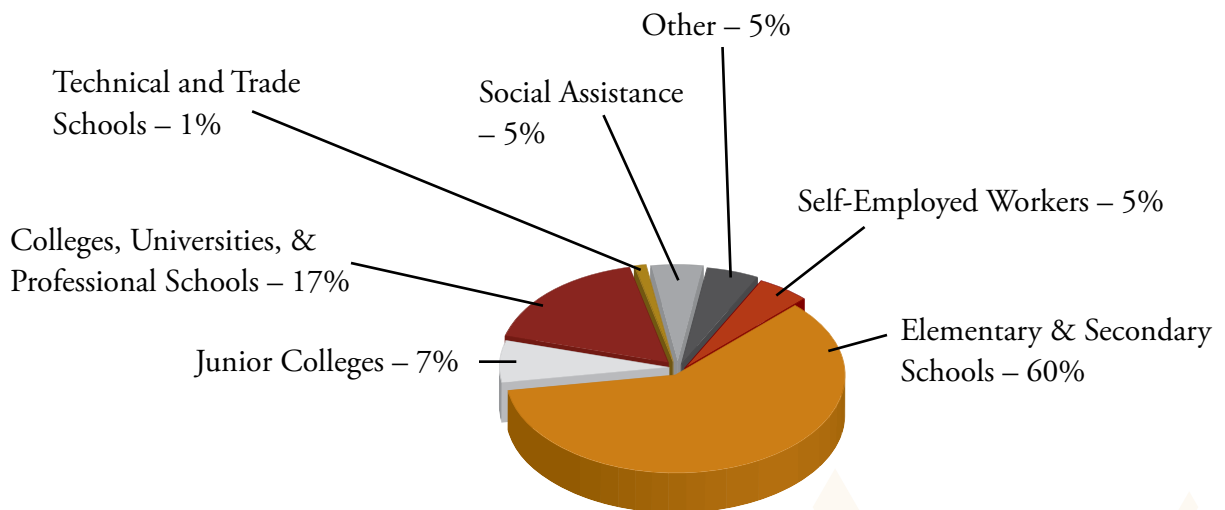

WHERE TO START: THE PATH FROM STUDENT TO COUNSELOR

The majority of counselors are in the public school education system working with grades Kindergarten through 12. All states require that school counselors hold a state school counseling certificate. Requirements for the issuance of the standard school counselor certificate in Texas are:

- Successful completion of a school counselor preparation program
- Master's degree from an accredited institution of higher education
- Two school years of classroom teaching experience in a public or accredited private school
