ONE CAREER WITH A HEALTHY OUTLOOK

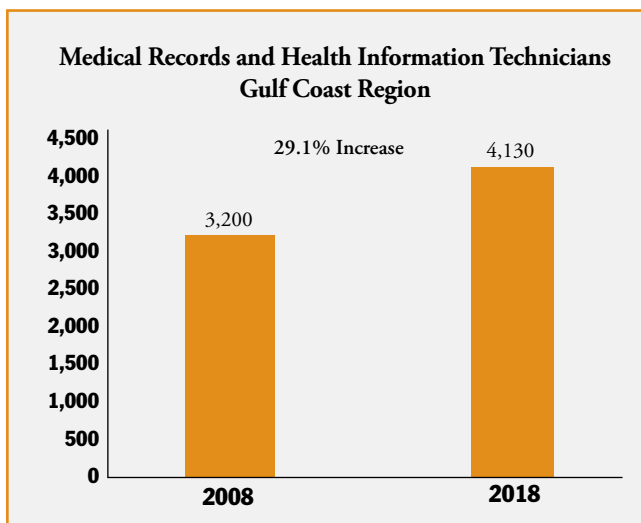
There's a growing job sector in the health care industry with a long and prosperous future ahead. Medical records technicians, also known as health information technicians, offer a career opportunity for those who wish to work in the health care industry, but not in patient care.

Medical records/health information technicians work in hospitals, physician offices, health maintenance organizations, community health centers and other health care organizations.

Job duties vary depending on the size and structure of the employer company, but generally, duties include compiling, processing, and maintaining medical records in a manner consistent with medical, administrative, ethical, legal, and regulatory requirements of the health care system. The outlook for medical records/health information technician careers is excellent.

Medical records and health information technicians earn good wages, averaging more than \$34,000 a year.

THE NUMBER OF MEDICAL RECORDS/HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNICIANS IS EXPECTED TO INCREASE BY 29 PERCENT BETWEEN 2008 AND 2018, MUCH FASTER THAN THE AVERAGE FOR ALL OCCUPATIONS (19.4 PERCENT).

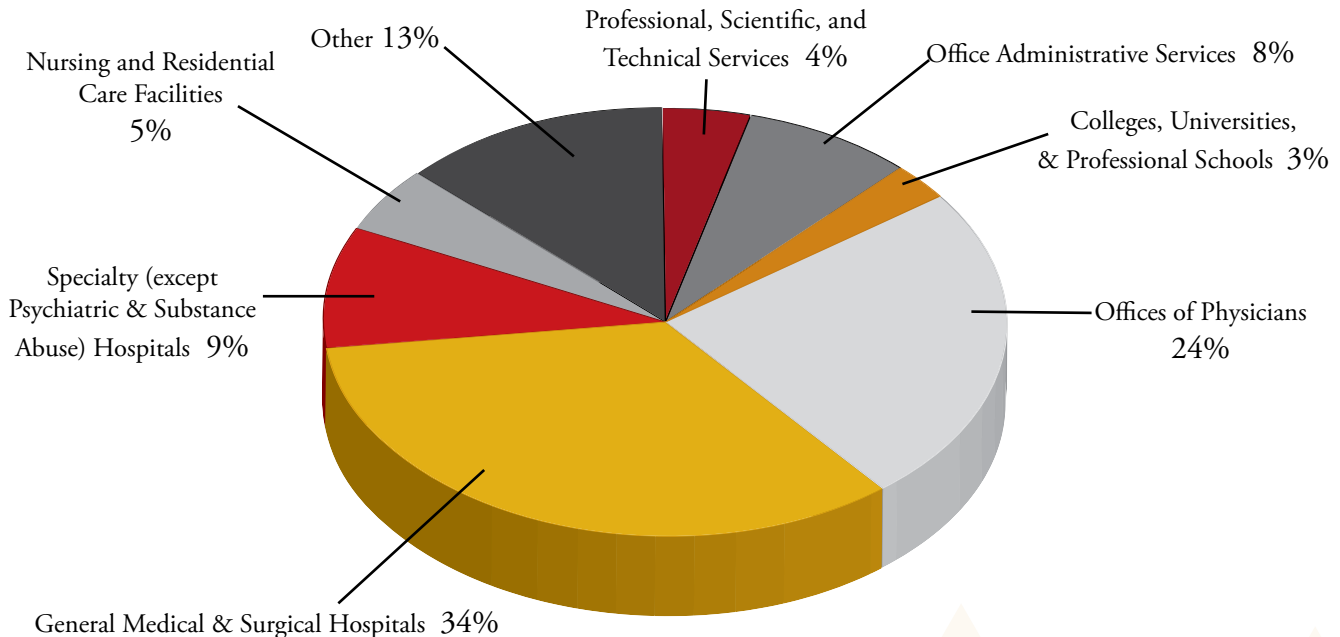

HOW DO YOU BECOME A MEDICAL RECORDS AND HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNICIAN?

Most employers prefer to hire registered health information technicians (RHIT). A written examination is offered by the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) for graduates of a two-year associate degree program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM).

ADVANCEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Experienced medical records and health information technicians are able to advance their careers by moving into supervisory positions or by specializing in Medicare coding or cancer registry. Advancement into a higher administrative position usually requires a bachelor's degree in medical records and health information administration.

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START EARLY AND BE PREPARED

High school students should strive for a high GPA. This will provide them with an edge needed for acceptance in and successful completion of a medical records/health information technician program.
