

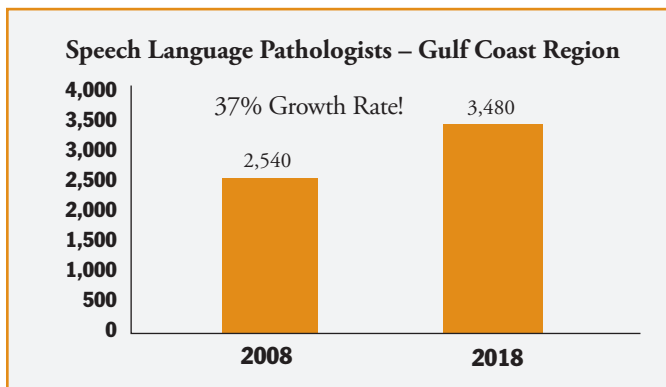

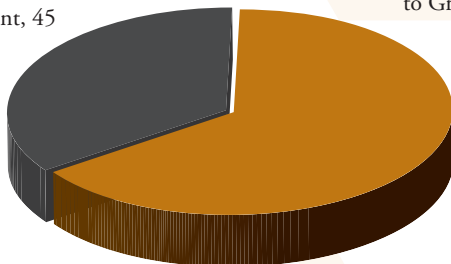

Openings Due to Replacement, 45



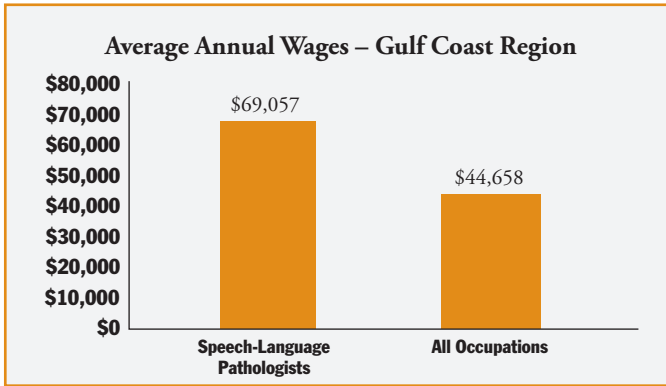

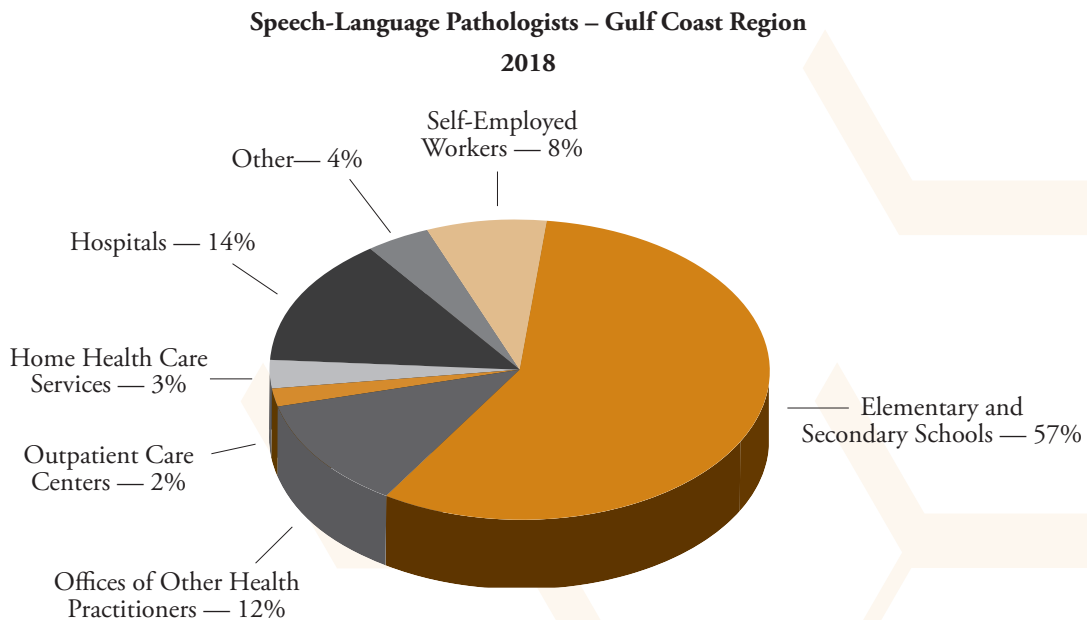

### **PATHWAY TO BECOMING A SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST**

Speech-language pathologists are regulated and licensed by the state in a way similar to that of registered nurses and doctors. So, how does a person become a licensed speech-language pathologist in Texas?

- Earn a bachelor's degree in communication sciences and disorders (4 yrs)
- Gain acceptance into and complete a master's degree program in speech language pathology (2 to 3 yrs) which includes a minimum of 375 hours of clinical experience
- Obtain an intern license from the Texas Department of State Health Services
- Take and pass the national Praxis exam coordinated by the Educational Testing Service (ETS) scoring a 600 or better
- Apply for official license at the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS)

### START EARLY AND BE PREPARED!

Students should strive for the highest GPA possible in undergrad to provide them with the edge needed for acceptance into graduate schools where seating is limited and many students are turned away (minimum GPA of 3.5 for some).

High school students interested in a career as a speech-language pathologist should take courses in biology, physics, chemistry, geometry, algebra, English, health occupations/medical professions education, sociology, psychology, computer skills, social studies, and speech.
