Austin County is located in East Central Texas and is one of 13 counties in the Gulf Coast Region. Austin County's 2018 population estimate was 29,565. Bellville is the county seat. Other towns include Sealy and Wallis. The Manufacturing, Trade, Service, and Local Government Sectors fuel county employment. Austin County is the home of Stephen F. Austin State Park. The average unemployment rate in Austin County for 2019 was 3.4 percent.

Per Capita Personal Income (2018)

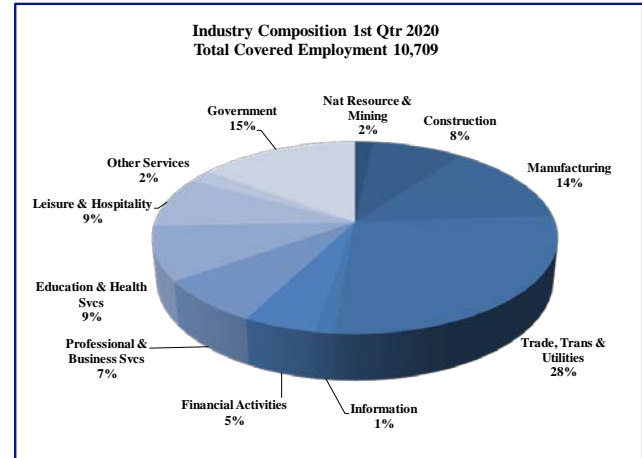

\$1,520,493,000 ranking 82nd in the State and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total.

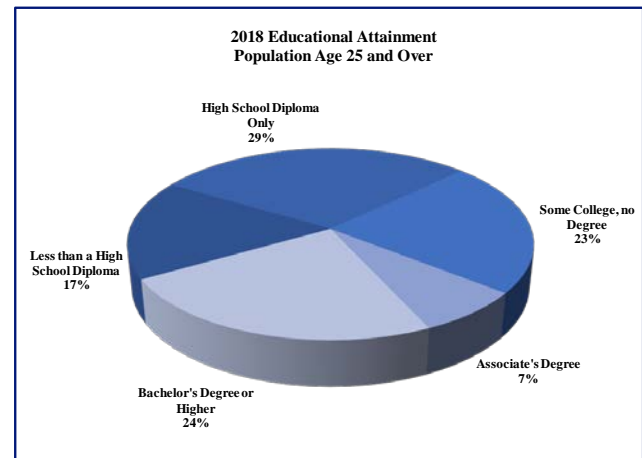
