Colorado County is located in East Central Texas and is one of 13 counties in the Gulf Coast Region. Colorado County's 2013 population estimate was 20,752. Columbus is the county seat. Other towns include Eagle Lake and Weimar. The Manufacturing, Trade, Service, and Local Government Sectors fuel county employment. Colorado County, created in 1836, is one of the original counties established in Texas by Stephen F. Austin. The average unemployment rate in Colorado County for 2013 was 5.2 percent.




