(HOUSTON) The Houston area unemployment rate fell more than half a point in May as more workers rejoined the labor market and over-the-month job growth saw a return to May 2019 levels. The not-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for May stands at 6.6 percent, according to data released Friday morning by Workforce Solutions.

Eight out of eleven industry supersectors showed growth last month, with Leisure & Hospitality, Education & Health Services, and Business & Professional Services accounting for 8 in 10 new jobs. "Professional & Business Services are socalled white-collar jobs with good pay and benefits," explained Parker Harvey, the Workforce Solutions economist. "After initially seeing a boost of hiring in professional and technical jobs during March and April, we're now seeing companies add administrative and support personnel, either through direct hiring or a staffing agency." May also saw strong hiring in Leisure & Hospitality, primarily at restaurants and bars. "Seasonal hiring also picked up in the entertainment and recreation subsectors as pools, theme parks, and other summer venues added staff," Harvey said.

In May, Governor Greg Abbott announced the state would no longer participate in the Federal Pandemic Unemployment Program. Additional benefits paid under the program ends June 26.
