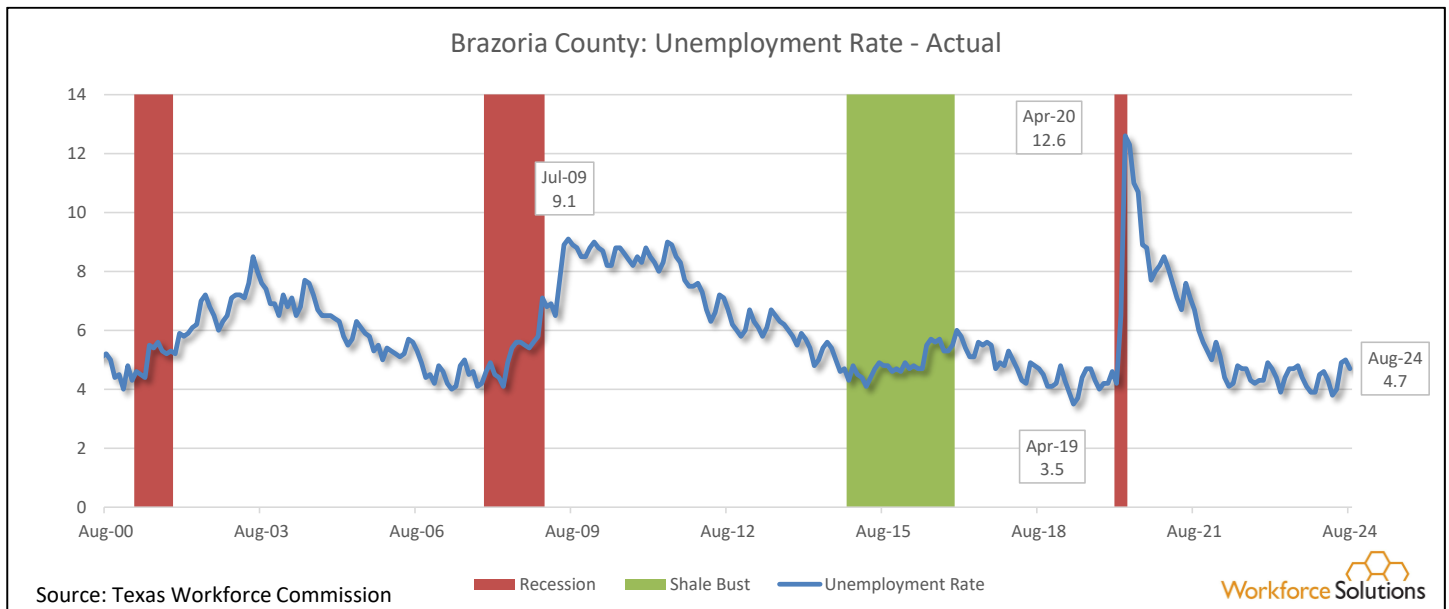
Labor Market Information

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County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Brazoria County fell three-tenths of a percentage point to 4.7 percent in August, one-tenth of a percentage point higher than a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than 4.4 percent at the state and national level. Total covered employment in the Brazoria County was down 401 jobs over first quarter 2024. The 0.3 percent seasonal decline was the same as the historical average since 2003. The primary contributors to the decline were Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, down 781 jobs or 3.4 percent, and Leisure and Hospitality, down 29 jobs or 1.9 percent. Losses were offset by substantial increases in Construction, up 340 jobs or 2.2 percent, Professional and Business Services, up 334 jobs or 3.7 percent, and Education and Health Services, up 106 jobs or 0.7 percent, helped offset overall losses. Payrolls in the county were up 2,903 jobs over the year in first quarter 2024 with the pace of job growth being rising to 2.5 percent from 1.1 percent in fourth quarter 2023. The top three contributors to the increase were Education and Health Services, up 1,096 jobs or 7.8 percent, Professional and Business Services, up 346 jobs or 3.9 percent, and Local Government, up 733 jobs or 4.3 percent. The largest declines were in Construction, down 105 jobs or 0.7 percent, and Manufacturing, down 71 jobs or 0.6 percent. The strongest decline was in Information, down 28 jobs or 7.3 percent. *Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
