

#### **County Employment Data\***

The rate of unemployment in Chambers County fell four-tenths of a percentage point to 4.3 percent in March, the same as it was a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than the broader state and national rates. Total covered employment in Chambers County experienced a net loss of 79 jobs over third quarter 2024, down 0.4 percent. The loss was a considerable improvement to third-quarter losses of the last two years, down 613 jobs in 2023 and 521 jobs in 2022. Largest third-quarter gains were found in Other Services, up 93 jobs or 9.1 percent, Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 87 jobs or 1.4 percent, and Education and Health Services, up 76 jobs or 5.2 percent. The largest contributors to third-quarter's decline were Professional and Business Services, down 105 jobs or 7.8 percent, Natural Resources and Mining, down 105 jobs or 13.9 percent, and Manufacturing, down 80 jobs or 2.3 percent. The county added 1,480 jobs over the year with the pace of job growth rising to 7.2 percent from 4.5 percent in the second quarter. Given that Chamber's County is among the top 10 U.S. counties with the fastest growth rates, it's no surprise to see the corresponding rapid job growth, as illustrated in the chart on page 7. Job gains were found in eight of eleven major industry sectors. Job gains were widespread with largest growth in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 520 jobs or 9.1 percent, Education and Health Services, up 394 jobs or 34.2 percent, and Construction, up 261 jobs or 15.2 percent. Overall gains were offset by losses in Other Services, down 275 jobs or 19.8 percent, and Professional and Business Services, down 118 jobs or 8.7 percent. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, this, and not could pay are included. Excluded are back pay, pury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. \*\*The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
