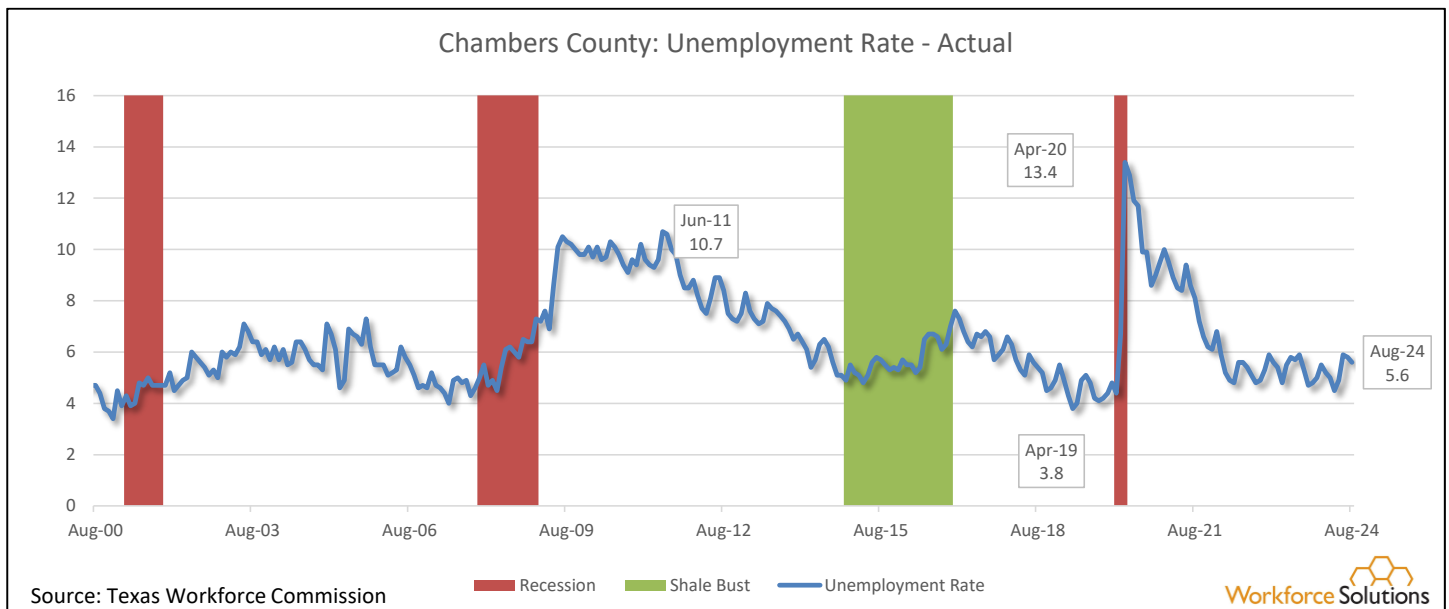

County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Chambers County fell two-tenths of a percentage point in August, three-tenths of a percentage point lower than a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than 4.4 percent at the state and national level. Total covered employment in Chambers County added 1,249 jobs over first quarter 2024. The 6.0 percent increase was much stronger than the historical average of 3.1 percent. Job gains were widespread with largest increases found in Construction, up 318 jobs or 19.4 percent, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 279 jobs or 4.8 percent. Strong gains were also found in Natural Resources and Mining, up 205 jobs or 33.5 percent, Leisure and Hospitality, up 184 jobs or 9.4 percent and Education and Health Services, up 156 jobs or 12.2 percent. The county added 692 jobs over the year, up 3.3 percent from first quarter 2023. Job gains were found in 8 of 11 major industry sectors. Largest gains were in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 813 jobs or 15.4 percent, Manufacturing, up 433 jobs or 13.7 percent, and Education and Health Services, up 358 jobs or 33.1 percent. Several industry sectors suffered declines including Construction, down 661 jobs or 25.3 percent, Other Services, down 544 jobs or 28.9 percent, and Professional and Business Services, down 208 jobs or 15.9 percent. *Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
