



Labor Market Information

County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Harris County fell two-tenths of a percentage point to 4.3 percent in March, one-tenth of a percentage point higher than a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than the broader state's 4.0 percent rate and the nation's 4.2 percent rate. Total covered employment in Harris County suffered its largest third-quarter loss since The Great Recession, down 15,986 jobs or 0.7 percent over third quarter 2024. added Nine of the eleven major industry sectors suffered declines. Largest contributors to the loss were: Public Administration where Local Government was down 6,479 jobs or 3.3 percent, Leisure and Hospitality, down 4,604 jobs or 1.8 percent, and Financial Activities, down 3,229 jobs or 2.5 percent. Job gains were limited to two private industry sectors with Manufacturing up 720 jobs or 0.4 percent and Professional and Business Services, up 589 jobs or 0.1 percent. The county reported its first over-the-year loss since first quester 2021 during the pandemic, down 1,946 jobs or 0.1 percent from third quarter 2023. Six of eleven industry sectors were reporting increases with the largest gains found in Natural Resources and Mining, up 5,482 jobs or 9.2 percent, Education and Health Services, up 5,354 jobs or 1.6 percent, and Other Services, up 3,364 jobs or 4.8 percent. The largest declines holding back gains were found in Financial Activities, down 9,862 jobs or 7.2 percent, and Public Administration where Local Government was down 7,685 jobs or 3.9 percent. Substantial declines were also found in Information, down 2,433 jobs or 10.2 percent, Construction, down 1,564 jobs or 0.9 percent, and Professional and Business Services, down 1,077 jobs or 0.2 percent. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements.**The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Whardon Counities.
