


Labor Market Information

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County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Liberty County fell three-tenths of a percentage point to 5.0 percent in March, the same as it was a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than the broader state's 4.0 percent rate and nation's 4.2 percent rate. Total covered employment in Liberty County suffered its first third-quarter loss since 2019, down 219 jobs or 1.1 percent over third quarter 2024. Second quarter growth was mixed with five of the eleven major industry sectors Public Administration where Local Government was down 108 jobs or 2.1 percent, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, down 71 jobs or 1.6 percent. Payrolls in the county were up 352 jobs over the year with the pace of job growth falling to 1.8 percent from 3.4 percent second quarter. Five of the eleven major industry sectors managed gains. The top three contributors to job growth were: Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 294 jobs or 7.4 percent, Manufacturing, up 145 jobs or 12.8 percent, and Public Administration, up 101 jobs driven by an addition of 235 jobs in State Government, 26.2 percent. Largest private-sector declines were found in Natural Resources and Mining, down 107 jobs or 23.6 percent, and Construction, down 74 jobs or 3.3 percent. In the public sector, while Public Administration manage a net increase of 101 jobs, Local Government was down 145 jobs or 2.8 percent. Additional details can be found pages 2 through 7.

*Data compiled by the Texas Workforce Commission, LMCI Dept. in cooperation with the Bureau of Labor Statistics as part of the Occupational Employment Survey. Employment is the estimate of employment based upon the sample, not the sample employment. Wages for the OES survey are straight-time, gross pay, exclusive of premium pay. Base rate, cost-of-living allowances, guaranteed pay, hazardous-duty pay, incentive pay including commissions and production bonuses, tips, and on-call pay are included. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazaria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Whardon Counties.
