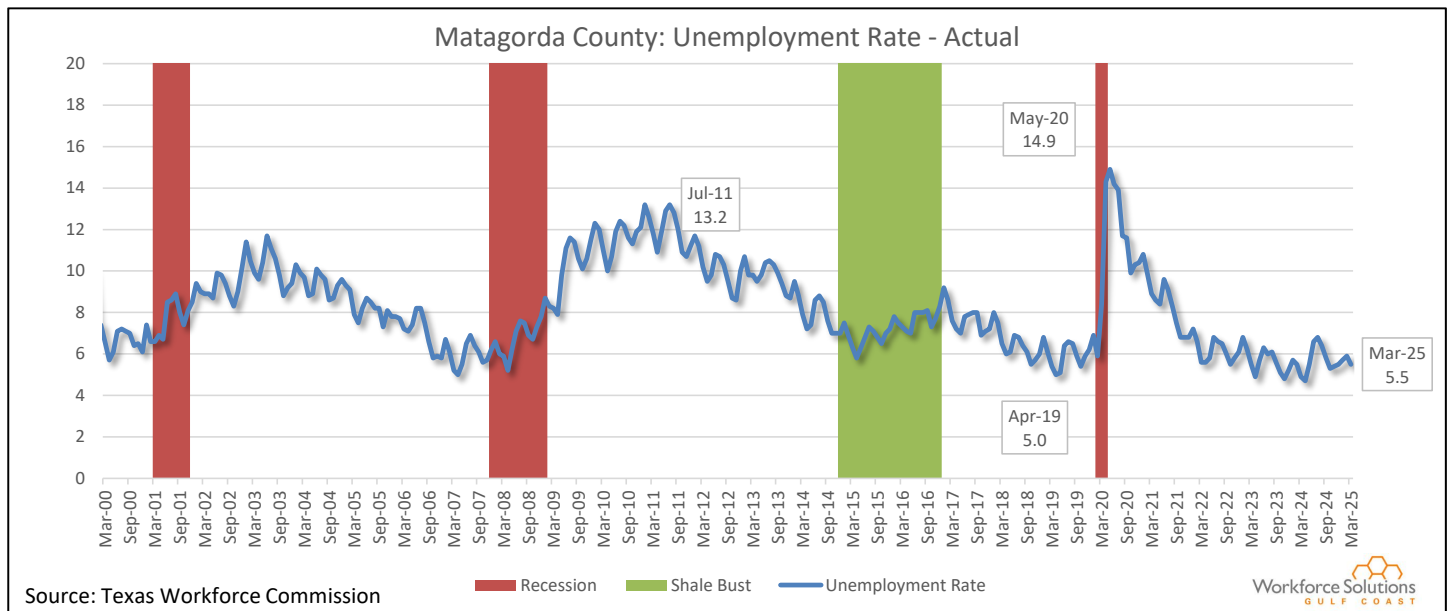

County Employment Data*

The rate of unemployment in Matagorda County fell four-tenths of a percentage point to 5.5 percent in March, six-tenths of a percentage point higher than it was a year earlier. The local rate of unemployment was higher than the broader state's 4.0 percent rate and the nation's 4.2 percent rate. Total covered employment in Matagorda County experienced a net loss of 63 jobs over third quarter 2024, down 0.6 percent. While the county has incurred losses over third quarter many times in the past, this was the first since during the pandemic in 2019. Largest contributors to the loss were Construction, down 83 jobs or 16.1 percent, Leisure and Hospitality, down 45 jobs or 3.7 percent, and Manufacturing, down 39 jobs or 2.6 percent. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities was instrumental in holding losses to a minimum with an increase of 117 jobs or 4.2 percent over the quarter. The county reported its fifth consecutive over-the-year loss, down 150 jobs or 1.3 percent from third quarter 2023. Two industry sectors were primarily responsible for the decline: Manufacturing, down 226 jobs or 13.2 percent, and Public Administration, down 58 jobs or 2.5 percent driven by declines in Local Government. Largest job gains were found in Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, up 133 jobs or 4.8 percent, and Leisure and Hospitality, up 83 jobs or 7.5 percent. Excluded are back pay, jury duty pay, overtime pay, severance pay, shift differentials, nonproduction bonuses, employer cost of supplementary benefits, and tuition reimbursements. **The Gulf Coast Region is defined as Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton Counties.
