

### **County Employment Data\***

Walker County's unemployment rate rose to 4.2% in May, an increase of 0.7 percentage points from the previous month and 0.3 points higher than a year earlier. The local rate was slightly above both the state and national averages, which stood at 4.0%. In the fourth quarter of 2024, Walker County added 700 jobs, a 2.7% increase. This pace of growth is consistent with recent years and well above the county's historical fourth-quarter average of 1.5%. The largest contributor to the increase was Leisure and Hospitality, which added 422 jobs (+17.7%). Minor losses were recorded in several sectors, with the most notable decline in Manufacturing, down 64 jobs (-4.6%). Over the year, from Q4 2023 to Q4 2024, the county added 1,015 jobs, representing a 3.9% annual growth rate, though down slightly by 0.2 percentage points from the third quarter. Eight of the eleven major industry sectors reported annual job gains. The largest increase came from Public Administration, which added 615 jobs, largely driven by State Government, up 574 jobs (+5.4%). Walker County's employment trends are often closely tied to State Government, as it is home to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice headquarters and Sam Houston State University. The second-largest contributor to job growth was Leisure and Hospitality, up 345 jobs (+14.0%). The only significant annual loss was in Construction, which declined by 71 jobs (-6.1%).
