

On March 10, 2023, the Texas Workforce Commission released employment statistics for **January 2023**. Our detailed regional report for researchers and analysts is at <u>http://www.wrksolutions.com/LocalStats</u>. Below are highlights.

JANUARY Regional Unemployment Rate (not seasonally adjusted)

- Represents 159,528 people looking for a new job
- DOWN from a peak of 14.2% in April 2020
- **UP** by 0.7% from last month
- DOWN from 5.1% from last year
- **HIGHER** than the statewide rate of 4.2%
- **HIGHER** than the national rate of 3.9%

Monthly Change – Employers in the Houston-Galveston region DROPPED -50,200 net jobs in January 2023

- Top-3 Drivers of month-to-month Job losses in January:
 - Trade, Transportation & Utilities (includes Retail) -13,800
 - Professional and Business Services -13,200
 - Leisure & Hospitality -6,800

Year-over-Year Change – Total Nonfarm employment was UP 4.9%

- This represents 152,900 more jobs compared to this period last year
- Currently, all 11 sectors show year-to-year growth

2022 Benchmark Revisions

In 2022, Houston-area employers created 33,300 fewer jobs than originally estimated. (179,000 estimated v. 145,700 actual), last year's job growth still exceeds the best years of the shale boom of a decade ago.
