SEPTEMBER Regional Unemployment Rate (not seasonally adjusted)

- Represents 186,871 people looking for a job
- **DOWN** from a peak of 13.5% in April 2020
- **DOWN** from 5.0% last month
- **UP** from 4.4% last year
- **HIGHER** than the statewide rate of 4.4%
- **HIGHER** than the national rate of 4.3%

Monthly Change – Employers in the Houston region added 13,800 jobs over the month, which is substantially above the long-term average increase of September.

- The top-3 drivers of over-the-month Job increase this September were:
 - o Government: 25.000
 - Private Education and Health Services: 2,700
 - o Construction: 200

Year-over-Year Change - Total Nonfarm employment was up 30,700 jobs or 0.9%.

- A year prior, growth stood at 41,500. Workforce Solutions currently forecasts a gain of 40,000 jobs by the end of 2026 subject to evolving developments across the local, state, and national economies.
- Currently, 8 of 11 sectors show over-the-year growth led by Private Education and Health Services,
 Government, and Leisure and Hospitality.
