Brazoria County is located in East Central Texas and is one of 13 counties in the Gulf Coast Region. Brazoria County's 2018 population estimate was 353,999. Angleton is the county seat. Other towns include Brazoria, Clute, Freeport and Lake Jackson. The Manufacturing, Trade, Service, Construction and Local Government Sectors fuel county employment. Brazoria County is home to chemical complexes, commercial fishing and a deepwater seaport. The average unemployment rate in Brazoria County for 2019 was 4.2 percent.

Per Capita Personal Income (2018)

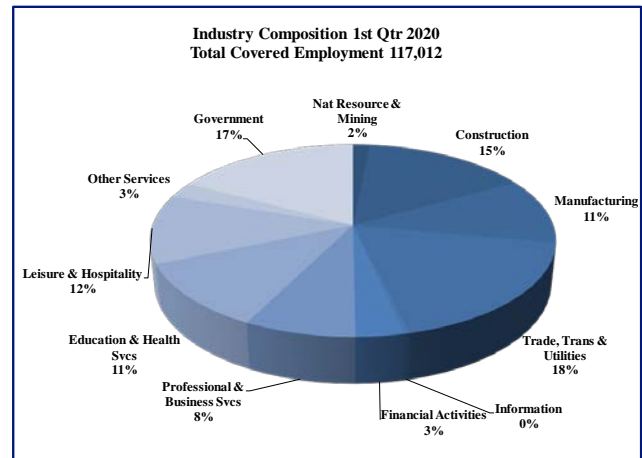

\$17,487,902,000 ranking 15th in the State and accounted for 1.2 percent of the state total.

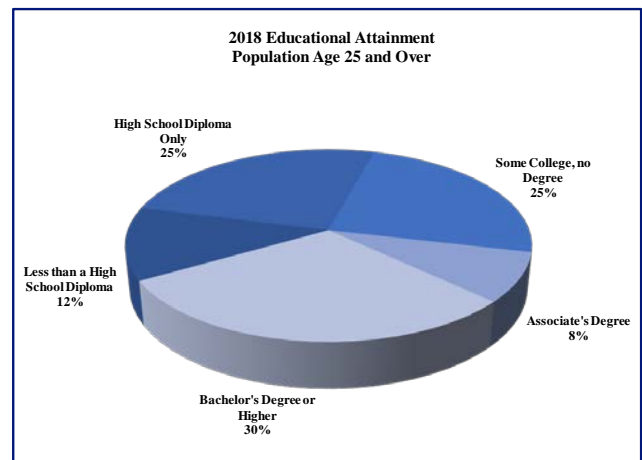
