## We Prosecute Child Care Fraud



Child Care contractors are on the front lines insuring that ONLY qualified children receive subsidized child care.

## Be aware of actions made by parents or guardians that may constitute fraud:

- Falsely reporting family income, family size, or hours in work or attendance in job training or educational programs
- Falsely reporting child care attendance
- Allowing child care providers to use attendance reporting "swipe cards"

## If a parent commits fraud, the Texas Workforce Commission can:

- Require the parent to repay all funds
- · Deny the family future child care eligibility for services
- Limit enrollment of the parent's children to regulated child care providers

## Child care fraud may be prosecuted as a felony:

- 3rd Degree Felony 2 to 10 years prison and/or up to \$10,000 fine
- State Jail Felony 180 days to 2 years state jail and/or up to \$10,000 fine
